IF YOUR PET HAS ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS, REHABILITATION MAY HELP

- Pain or discomfort
- Difficulty jumping up or down
- Crying when getting up or lying down
- Reluctance to play or exercise
- Unusual posture

- Lameness
- Uneven wear on nails
- Overweight
- Panting excessively

UNDERWATER TREADMILL

or hydro treadmill uses the ancient therapeutic effect of warm water plus the buoyancy and resistance of water to support your pet while having the benefit of a safe, proven exercise regime. Benefits of this type of conditioning include muscle strengthening, improved flexibility, improved cardiovascular fitness, weight loss and it is fun!



ACUPUNCTURE

Acupuncture is the ancient Chinese technique of inserting needles in specific points around the body to affect the nervous system. Its primary use in rehabilitation therapy is for pain management or stimulation of the nervous system in disc disease, arthritis, and post surgery as well as to help stimulate the nerve fibres in cases of paralysis.
